

### How Grading Will Work

I will grade your performance this semester on the amount of quality work you complete, and on your ability to meet deadlines and fulfill expectations. Your peers and I will address the “quality” of your writing in our feedback. We will also invite you to put forward the substantial time and effort it takes to improve upon the quality of your writing. Further, your writing products must meet the course objectives and the requirements put forth. The goal is to focus on your learning and development as a writer rather than on guessing who I want you to be as a writer. I invite you to take greater risks as a writer – this risk-taking is the most important thing you can do to develop as a researcher and writer.

### Revising Opportunity

You may choose to revise **one** of the three papers for a new grade during the semester. Revised essays must be submitted to D2L with Track Changes enabled so that all alterations from the original may be seen. (Set up an appointment with me if you would like a quick tutorial of Track Changes on Word.) The revised essay must be accompanied by a 300–500-word explanation of what major changes were addressed and how they contribute to making your essay more effective.

### Grading System

Your grade will be determined on a 1000-point scale, dividing total points earned by total points possible. Points will be awarded as follows:

- Project 1 (Literacy Narrative): 200 points (20%)
- Project 2 (Literacy Profile): 200 points (20%)
- Project 3 (Genre Analysis): 200 points (20%)
- Project 4 (Reflection Presentation): 200 points (20%)
- In-Class/Online Participation: 100 points (10%)
- Asynchronous Work: 60 points (6%)
- Peer Workshops: 40 points (4%)
